POSITION FUNCTION SUMMARY: A working supervisor responsible for the diagnostics, scheduling, coordinating, and supervision of maintenance and repairs to the city's water and wastewater systems and capable of covering for the Utilities Foreman when not available.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: THE STATEMENTS BELOW ARE INTENDED TO DESCRIBE THE GENERAL NATURE AND LEVEL OF WORK BEING PERFORMED BY INDIVIDUAL(S) ASSIGNED TO THIS POSITION. THEY ARE NOT INTENDED TO BE AN EXHAUSTIVE LIST OF ALL RESPONSIBILITIES, DUTIES AND SKILLS REQUIRED OF PERSONNEL SO CLASSIFIED IN THIS POSITION. THE POSITION DESCRIPTION IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE CITY AS THE NEEDS OF THE CITY AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE POSITION CHANGE.

- Assists the work crews in all activities involved in the maintenance, diagnostics repair, and installation of the water distribution and wastewater collection systems, as well as any repairs as a result of these actions.
- Responsible for all aspects of the water distribution and wastewater collection systems as well as inventory control of the warehouse.
- Responsible for the preventative maintenance program for the water and sanitary sewer system which include valve, hydrant, and manhole maintenance.
- Use hydro unit for cleaning out sanitary sewer lines.
- Responsible for repairs to water main and sewer lines.
- Repair broken water lines with new sections of pipe and new taps.
- Performs water service taps and new meter and box installations.

- Assists in the diagnostics of problem areas and develops course of action and ensures efficient completion.
- Operate and maintain underground sewer televising equipment.
- Perform line locates, yard restoration, and assist the engineering department with contractors.
- Be able to read basic construction plans as well as understand the geographical makeup of the city.
- Operates light and heavy commercial equipment; light and heavy power tools; and a variety of hand tools; and is responsible for their responsible operation to ensure the safe functioning and lifespan of this equipment.
- Complete evaluation paperwork of subordinates.
- Required to complete work orders.
- Work involves evening, weekends, holidays, overtime and on-call on a rotation basis.
- Required to work as an essential employee before, during and after an emergency or disaster.
- Performs any other duties and responsibilities as directed by the Foreman
- Regular attendance is an essential function of this position.
- Performs other duties, special tasks and responsibilities as directed.
- Required to work as an essential employee before, during and after an emergency or disaster, whether natural or acts of war.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES: TO PERFORM THIS POSITION SUCCESSFULLY, AN INDIVIDUAL(S) MUST BE ABLE TO PERFORM EACH ESSENTIAL DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITY SATISFACTORILY. THE REQUIREMENTS LISTED BELOW ARE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE KNOWLEDGE, SKILL, AND/OR ABILITY REQUIRED.

- Knowledge of all aspects of operations, maintenance, repairs and installations of the distribution and collection systems. (i.e. installation and repairs of main line pressure and gravity flow pipe of all materials, service lines near and far side pressure and gravity flow, hydrants, valves, manholes, cleanouts).
- Knowledge of water distribution and wastewater collection operations and repairs using general plumbing, concrete work, fencing, and landscaping. Knowledge of heavy and light equipment; and a variety of hand and power tools
- This position is moderately physical in nature and may demand moving from remote location to remote location over a variety of terrain.
- Ability to follow oral and written directions.
- Ability to maintain daily work orders.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with coworkers, supervisors and the general public.
- Must be able to work well in a team; have basic interpersonal skills; and be effective under self-supervision.
- Problem solving skills helpful.

• Ability to follow and adhere to City and departmental rules, regulations, policies and procedures.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING: The preferred way to obtain the minimum knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the essential duties and responsibilities of this position are listed below. The City reserves the right to allow substitutions in the event that a candidate or incumbent exceeds requirements in one area but may be deficient in another.

Formal Education:

- High school diploma or equivalent GED.
- Relatable Work Experience:
- Two (2) years experience in operation and maintenance of water and wastewater systems.
- Backhoe operator experience required.

Training (License and/or Certification):

- Valid Texas Commercial Driver's License (Class A).
- TCEQ Class C distribution desired or should be obtained within 2 years of employment.
- TCEQ Class II wastewater collection license desired or should be obtained within 4 years of employment.

On frequent occasions, the employee will be at remote locations traveling unleveled terrain and working in underground areas in tight spaces.
